

# Some Stubborn, Persistent and Important Problems in the United States


- Water and drought

- Politically difficult






# The Challenge of Mediating "Fact" Intensive Problems



#### 1. Not a Panacea

Cannot fix all the shortcomings of how we manage public policies, the uses of science, and the complexity of reconciling different views.

#### **BUT**

Can add significantly to better decision-making if we can accelerate the update of JFF.



# 2. Adds to...Not replaces

Is a specialized form of consultation and public engagement.

A <u>complement</u> to and not a <u>replacement</u> of our legislative, judicial, and regulatory decision-making processes.



# 3. Has Utility

#### **MORE** USEFUL FOR

Sorting out "fact" centered problems, i.e. how many animals and plants are endangered; how will this new road affect drive times; at what levels do emissions become toxic; etc.

#### **LESS** USEFUL FOR

Sorting out "value" centered problems, i.e. which animals and plants should we prioritize for recovery; how will this new road affect our lifestyles; etc.

# 4. Has Many Different Uses

- •Isolating <u>specific</u> factual questions are at the heart of public policy debates.
- •Narrowing or resolving specific complex factual <u>disagreements</u>.
- •Agreeing on the kinds of disciplines and expertise required to present evidence that will be respected by all sides.
- •Identifying the specific scientific or technical expertise needed and commissioning specific research.
- •Creating agreed upon estimates, forecasts and trends; more accurately describing cause and effect relationships; providing a pertinent summary of peer-reviewed literature.

# 5. Is Adaptive

- Can be a "standalone" process.
- Can be "embedded" as a phase of other collaboration processes.



# A Checklist for Organizing a JFF

- ✓ High level political support
- A willingness to participate by key stakeholders and and technical experts.
- ✓ Independent facilitation.
- ✓ Sufficient time for a process.
- Sufficient funding.
